HOBBS, Karolyn Kay “Kay” 77, of Yuba City, CA, passed away Sunday, October 29, 2017 at The Fountains Nursing Home. Kay suffered from Alzheimer’s disease for several years. She was born in Atchison, KS, and later moved to Hutchinson, KS, where she eventually met her husband, Charlie Hobbs. They were married Nov. 1961. Kay worked as a registered nurse for 30 years at doctors’ offices, hospitals, and even as a hospice caregiver. She and Charlie then moved to Duluth, GA, owning and operating Don’s Country Kitchen for 12 years. During that period, Kay went back to school and became a certified financial planner. Charlie and Kay moved to New Port Richey, FL, Dec. 1990, where she ran her own business, managing bills and financials for her clients. Along with her regular clients, Kay took on wards of the county to manage their financials for them as they overcame their hardships such as addiction, alcoholism, and mental issues. Kay was a member of the board for the Marine Institute for troubled youth in the community. She was also a member of multiple other groups for women, children, and the elderly. She also helped community members in many ways. Kay never knew a stranger and was always there to help, always with a smile, and a joke. She is survived by her two sons, John Hobbs (Jamie) of Atlanta, GA and Joseph Hobbs (Michelle) of Jackson, MO; a daughter, Kathy Steele of Yuba City, CA; one sister, Susan Hernandez (Dennis) of Coldwater, KS; and one brother, Patrick Farrell (Teena), of Hilton Head, SC; six grandchildren; one great-grandson and two more on the way. She truly adored being around all of

her nieces and nephews and picking on them as well. Kay's wishes were to have everyone remember all the good times they had and to try to continue giving back to others as she was able to do.
